The Town of Jackson has signed a contract with the developer of Dollar General to build a Dollar General Market in town. The DG Market is designed to be a neighborhood market and grocery with approximately 12,400 square feet offering fresh produce and frozen meats. The market will have an expanded grocery inventory, including 30 coolers that offer frozen foods and meats. Dollar General has agreed to purchase approximately 2 acres from the town at the corner of Tisdale Street and Atomic Road with store access on Tisdale Street.

The Municipal Election Commission of the Town of Jackson, SC announces the general election for the Town of Jackson to be Tuesday, April 25, 2023. Any person wishing to register to vote in this election must do so no later than March 24, 2023. To register, one must contact Aiken County Registration and Election Voter Registration Office at 803-642-2028. The following offices shall be included in this election:

Citizens desiring to be candidates for one of the above listed offices may file at the Town Clerk's office in the Jackson Municipal Complex located at 106 Main Street in Jackson, SC. Books will be open for filing at noon on February 10, 2023, and remain open during regular business hours until February 24, 2023, at noon. The filing fee for Mayor is \$100.00. The filing fee for Council is \$75.00. The Aiken County Election Commission plans to open absentee envelopes at 9:00 a.m., on Election Day, at 1930 University Parkway Ste. 1200, Aiken County Government Center, The Aiken County Registration and Election Commission. On Thursday, April 27, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. at the Jackson Municipal Complex located at 106 Main Street in Jackson, SC the Municipal Election Commission will hold a hearing to determine the validity of ballots challenged in this election. Any runoff will be held two weeks after the election on Tuesday, May 09, 2023. The following polling location will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m.: Jackson Municipal Complex, 106 Main Street, Jackson, SC

Water Billing

The billing schedule is as follows:

- Bills are mailed out the first of the month
- Bills are due the 20th of the same month
- Late fee of \$10 will be applied after the 20th
- An additional late fee of \$25 will be applied after 10:00AM on the 27th and you will be subject to disconnection.
- Please be aware that tampering or removing a lock from a meter is in violation of State Law. You could be charged fees and/or punishable by law.

If you do not receive a bill, please contact our office for your account balance. We do not print duplicate bills. Failure to receive a bill does not excuse non-payment. You can also choose to have your bill emailed to you. We will send out reminders via automated phone calls to those who have not paid. Please make sure your phone number has been updated with our office. Automated reminders will come from phone number (803) 471-2229.

Police Corner

Many citizens of Jackson may not be aware that there is SC State Law specific to the use of **golf carts** on the roadway. Below is information taken directly from the SC Department of Public Safety website at https://scdps.sc.gov/ohsjp/DrivinginSC/Golf-Cart-Law

Before you or someone you know takes a golf cart for a drive, be sure to follow the checklist below:

- The golf cart must be insured, permitted, and registered with SCDMV using the following link http://scdmvonline.com/Vehicle-Owners/Types-Of-Vehicles/Golf-Cart
- The golf cart must remain within 4 miles of your home, where it is legal to drive.
- The golf cart may be operated on roads with posted speeds of 35 mph or less.
- The golf cart may be operated during daylight hours only.
- The driver must be at least 16 years old with a valid driver's license.

Golfcart violations result in a \$100 fine and/or up to 30 days in jail.

It is against the law to operate motorized vehicles on sidewalks. This includes golf carts, side by sides, 4- wheelers. We have seen increased damage to the sidewalks and light poles from damage caused by these vehicles.

Animals at large have become an increasing issue within the town. We have seen an increase in calls associated with animal complaints. Animals, and most specifically dogs, should be contained within one's yard. Officers are often left with no other means of remedy other than coordinating with the Aiken County Animal Control Shelter who will come and take the animal. We have seen a recent case involving an 11 year old Grovetown child in the past few weeks that was attacked by several dogs. We do not want this happening here. All animal calls should be placed through the Dispatch Center (please see below).

Last, and very important note- all calls for a Jackson Police
Department Officer should go through the Aiken County Sheriff's
Office Dispatch Center at (803) 642-1763 or 911 for emergencies.

This ensures the closest officer is dispatched to you and it also ensures that a record of your call is maintained. Officers are often not in the office as they are responding to calls or out on patrol. We assist the Aiken County Sheriff's Office as they do the same for us.
